Jesus, the Good Shepherd, will not allow anyone to snap from his care the sheep that belong to him. He will give them eternal life.

What does 'belonging to him' involve?

The **first requirement** is to listen to his voice, that is, to heed his teachings.

And the **second requirement** is to follow him, that is, to do his word.

The image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd is one of the loveliest images we have of him. And we owe it to Jesus himself. This is how he described himself and his mission.

Jesus is no hireling. The hireling doesn't own the sheep, and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf approaching. Jesus is the Good Shepherd. The sheep belong to him, and he's ready to die for them.

Fabric Update for St Columba's and St Peter's

St Columba's: The work at the back of the church has been successfully completed. The cross on the external church roof has been replaced. The new carpets have been fitted on the sanctuary and the aisles.

Now we have, hopefully beginning soon, the painting of the large hall and stair well. The exterior windows of the convent are to be painted. Budget cost for hall are £25,000 and for the windows £13,000.

St Peter's sanctuary: Many share my frustration at the length of time the stone masons are taking on the sanctuary. This is due to problems they've had with weather and their vehicle. They have now produced a programme of works which will see the sanctuary field finished at the beginning of June and the new pieces of sanctuary furniture appearing during the summer months. Let's ask for God's blessing on the work. The new lighting, sound system and carpet are all ready to go once the stone masons have completed their work.
